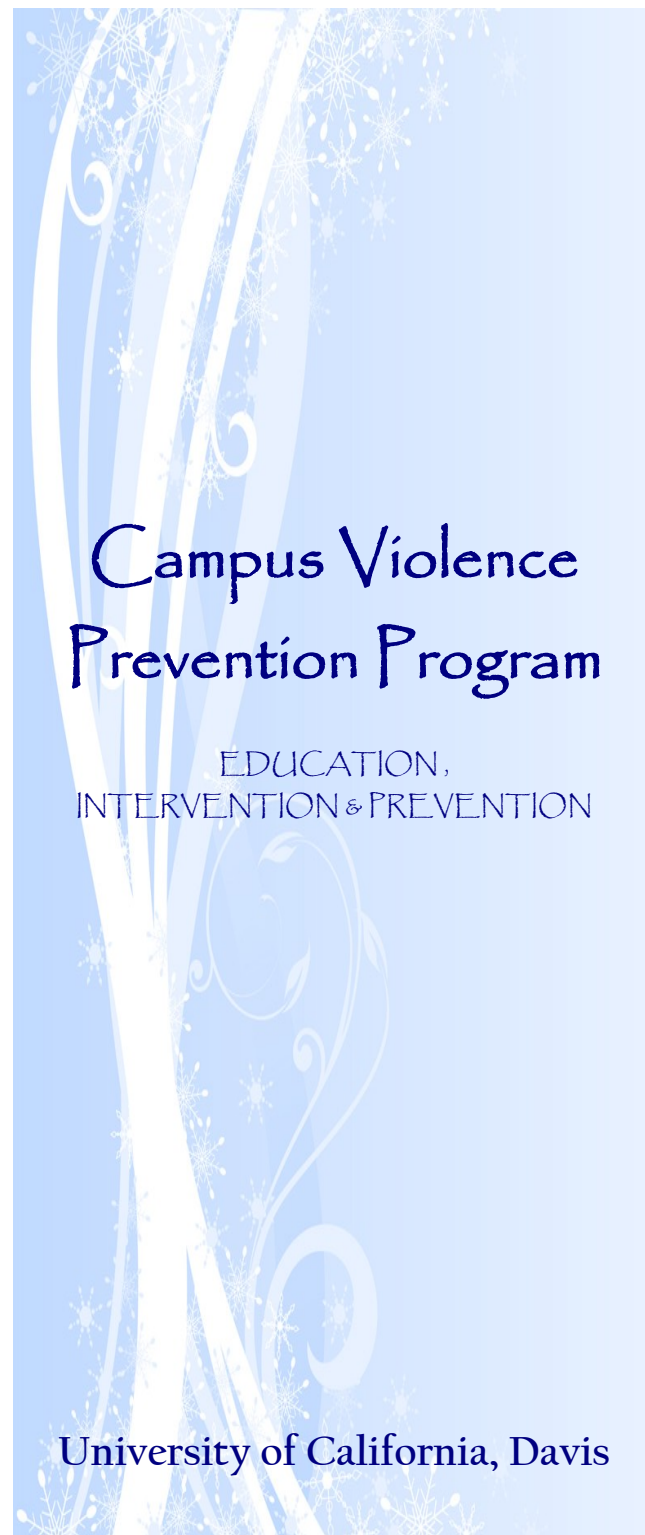

Campus Violence Prevention Program

Campus Violence Prevention Program (CVPP) provides confidential intervention and prevention **services related to sexual assault, dating and domestic violence, stalking and other forms of harassment and violence** to the UC Davis campus and Medical Center.

SEXUAL ASSAULT is ANY sexual act that is attempted or committed without the other person's consent.

DATING AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE is a pattern of physical, emotional and/or sexual abuse between intimate partners, where one partner is attempting to gain power and control over the other.

STALKING is a pattern of behavior that is directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to experience fear. Stalking behaviors might include unwanted emails, phone calls, gift-giving, following, etc.

All services are:

- Confidential
- Free
- Available to students, staff, and faculty

Victim/Survivor Services

Services are available to any UC Davis student, staff or faculty member who needs them **regardless of gender, ethnicity, age, religion, disability or sexual orientation.**

A victim advocate is available to provide confidential and case specific intervention services.
