

Client Feedback Survey

of clients said that their advocate was supportive & nonjudgmental.

said they felt their gender identity, ethnicity, and sexual orientation was respected at CARE.

94% said that their advocate helped them to plan for their safety.

93% said that their advocate helped them to understand their reporting options.

85% said that working with an advocate helped them to be academically successful.

Nearly 100% of clients who responded to the survey said they would refer others to CARE.

In 2023, CARE received approval to hire an additional victim advocate on a contract basis, bringing the total number of victim advocacy staff to 3, and the total FTE to 8 career staff and 2 part-time student assistants.
