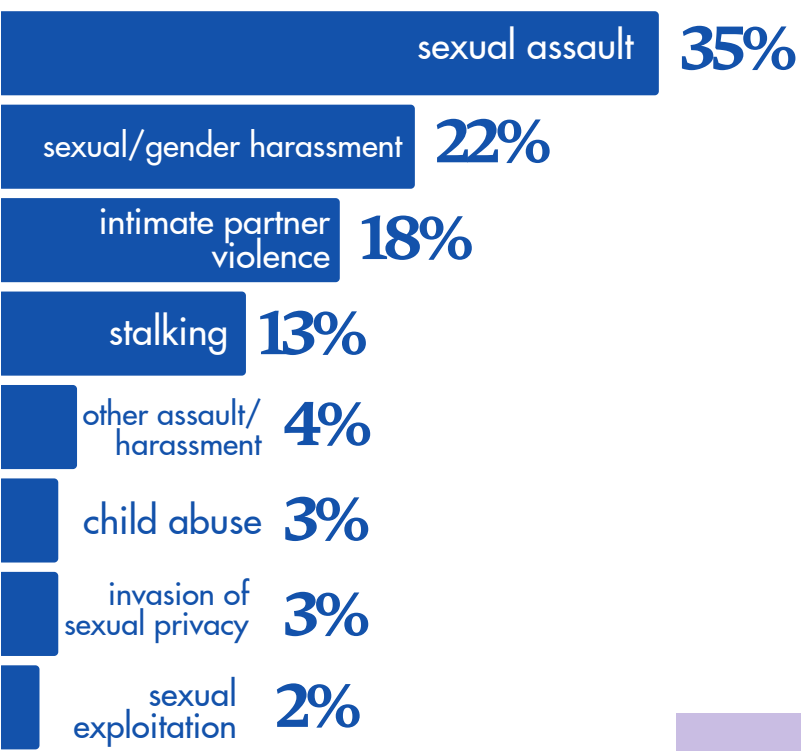

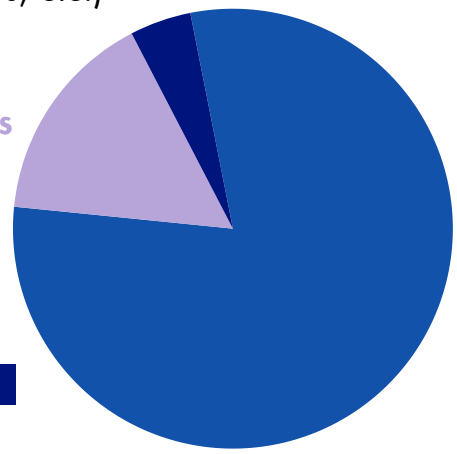

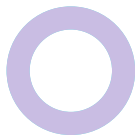

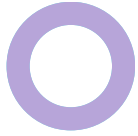
# Client Feedback Survey



Nearly **100%** said that their advocate was supportive and nonjudgmental, understood their concerns, and followed up about their needs and wellbeing.



**87%** said that their advocate helped them plan for their safety.



Nearly **100%** said they felt their gender identity, ethnicity, and sexual orientation were respected at CARE.



Over **80%** said that their advocate helped them to understand reporting options.



Over **90%** said they would refer others to CARE.



Almost **80%** said that working with an advocate helped them to be academically successful.

# Prevention Education, Training, & Outreach
